The Goals of the King

At Nehemiah University we follow the Goals of the King (Mat 28:18-20). Our God and Savior has given his people

a mission to accomplish; they are to make more disciples. People need the Gospel. People need to know that Jesus has provided in Himself the solution to the brokenness of creation and they need to know Him. To make more disciples of Jesus, we must tell others about salvation that is only through faith in Christ. To be a faithful disciple folks need to make that first step of obedience and identification that is water baptism. Many of the students who come for classes were baptized at some time in the past, yet their baptism was frequently not followed up by good teaching and training. The second command given by Jesus in the passage involves teaching obedience to His commands.

In our classes we expose the students to the rich variety of scripture that is in the Old and New Testaments. We attempt to give our students the context they need to understand and obey the commands of Jesus. Nehemiah University assists the Gospel Mission in this most fundamental of Christian tasks. People need to know Jesus as their Lord and Savior and become His disciples. They need to identify themselves as disciples and follow Him in obedience. They must be equipped and to be taught as disciples and also how to make more disciples. This is the task of Nehemiah University. This is the guide for all our classes.

We'd like to highlight our relationship of many years with the students of Cedarville University. Throughout the school year, Cedarville students support our youth ministry by
