### Bible Institute Report

At Nehemiah Bible Institute, we are encouraged this year

about the growth in the number of our students. We averaged 18 students in our Tuesday and Thursday classes during the first quarter of this year. That is exciting! Our year began with our 101 class—The Basics of the Christian Faith. Thursdays for the next 8 quarters will see a sequential presentation of our basic series of classes covering OT and NT surveys and survey of Christian Doctrine. On Tuesdays we continued with our basic series with a survey of Christian Doctrine I and will conclude in the current quarter with Christian Doctrine II.

Our students enjoy coming to Bible class and engaging with the Bible and various Biblical topics. It is especially encouraging when one of the students takes the time to pursue things further and completes the required work for our Bible Certificate. During the first quarter one student completed the requirements for a Certificate in both classes! This means that he presented his testimony to the class, memorized the Apostles creed, and wrote a summary of his doctrinal beliefs, and passed his tests. We are looking forward to continuing on with our students during the new quarter.

### The Latest Generation Z

Youth born between mid-1990s and 2015 are considered as part of generation Z; 25% of the population of the United States. Gen Z—the generation following the millennials—is the least Christian generation to date, according to a new Barna study – 34 percent of Gen Z's religious affiliation is either atheist, agnostic or none. In fact, teens 13-18 years old are twice as likely as adults to say they are atheist. And just three in five 13- to 18-year-olds say they are some kind of Christian (59 percent). Many in this group have never been exposed to Christianity. We are living in a world where values and beliefs are becoming arbitrary. This is a generation that is looking for reality. They know the digital world is make believe but yet it has serious consequences on their lives. We want to give them some anchor points to build their lives upon. Harnessed technology can be a real tool for a Christian life. Our challenge is to take the new generation and its tools and show them the steadfastness of God in that He has a plan for every soul and every generation...even generation Z. Pray that our staff would be able to effectively show them the reality of life in Christ as the foundation of all generations.

### A Youthful Workout - Rich Anglin, Dir. of Ministry Development

Our youth ministry is quite active, with programs five nights/week and Saturday mornings. The number of children continues to grow, averaging 25-30 a night, with our Friday night God's Boys and God's Girls programs reaching nearly 40 youngsters combined. While most of the children we serve reside in the South Park neighborhood, children living in Old North Dayton and in the neighborhoods along North Main Street and Salem Avenue are able to participate through our van/bus ministry.

Bible teaching is a critical part of everything we do. We are very intentional about sharing the Gospel of Jesus Christ with our children, trusting in the promise that God's Word will not return void (Isaiah 55:11). We are currently studying the Gospel of Mark, combining scripture with a variety of age-appropriate video resources.

We are so thankful for available space in God's Gymnasium and Nehemiah University. With the increased numbers of children served, we are able to break the children up into smaller groups based upon age/gender. We are also updating our game room for children who are less physically active. The warmer weather will allow us to use our outdoor recreational fields once again. Friday nights are also an opportunity for our youth programs to travel to Camp Jabez.

We continue to seek volunteers for our mid-week evening programs. So many of our children come from difficult family circumstances and need Christian adult role models. 1-2 hours a week can be used mightily by the Lord to greatly impact the hearts of hurting children. Perhaps this is an area where you might feel a call to serve?
